

Servant Team Expectations – 2019-2020

Servant Team exists to equip, encourage, and empower students to serve Christ through Godly leadership. Through Servant Team you will have an opportunity to build a foundation and Biblical basis for Godly leadership in your life and also be part of a team that works with a local organization in the community.

Application: Please complete by June 30. After completing the application, there may be an interview. The interviews will be taking place the first and second week of July.

Servant Team is a serious commitment. There are a limited number of spots available; therefore, we want all members of the team to make it a priority. We expect students to be at all meetings, taking off of work and other commitments, when necessary. If a student absolutely must miss a meeting (ie: family vacation or illness), they must communicate well in advance with Pat Brady. The meetings will take place from 6:00-8:30 pm at the Brady's home or at the organization we are serving with.

Expectations: Below are the expectations¹ we have for each student who agrees to be part of Servant Team. We are not looking for perfect students but *willing* students. We encourage you to honestly evaluate whether or not you are willing to be:

1. One who **follows Christ** and therefore lives your life, both in and outside of church, in a way that honors and glorifies God and commits to represent Christ and Blackhawk Church well.
2. One who **makes Servant Team a priority**. Attendance is mandatory at all meetings.
3. One who is **willing to serve others and put others needs before their own**. It is expected that students will both be willing to serve and invite their friends to programming and other events/trips.
4. One who is actively **pursuing spiritual growth** in community. This could be through a Home Group or a mentoring relationship.
5. One who has a **heart for non-believers** and prays regularly for your lost peers, encouraging them on their spiritual journey.
