Servant Team is a serious commitment. There are a limited number of spots available; therefore, we want all members of the team to make it a priority. We expect students to be at all meetings, taking off of work or other commitments, when necessary. If a student absolutely must miss a meeting (ie: family vacation or illness), they must communicate well in advance with Pat Brady and Melissa Ernst. The meetings will take place from 6:00-8:30 pm at the Brady's home or at the place we are serving together.

Expectations: Below are the expectations we have for each student who agrees to be part of Servant Team. We are not looking for perfect students but willing students. We encourage you to honestly evaluate whether or not you are willing to be:

1. One who **follows Christ** and therefore lives your life, both in and outside of church, in a way that honors and glorifies God and commits to represent Christ and Blackhawk Church well.
2. One who **makes Servant Team a priority**. Attendance is mandatory at all meetings.
3. One who is **willing to serve others and put others needs before their own**. It is expected that students will both be willing to serve and invite their friends to programming and other events/trips.
4. One who is **actively pursuing spiritual growth** in community. This could be through a Home Group or a mentoring relationship.
5. One who has a **heart for non-believers** and prays regularly for your lost peers, encouraging them on their spiritual journey.
